LINCOLN MEMORIAL TOUR

The Lincoln Memorial, located at the western end of the National Mall in Washington, D.C., honors the life and legacy of Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President of the United States. Completed in 1922 and designed by architect Henry Bacon, the memorial draws inspiration from Greek Doric temples. At its center, a 19-foot-tall marble statue of Lincoln by sculptor Daniel Chester French sits in thoughtful repose. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY

The Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, located on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., is a world-renowned center for the study and exhibition of natural history. Opened in 1910, the museum houses over 146 million specimens, including fossils, minerals, plants, and cultural artifacts. Its iconic exhibits, such as the Hope Diamond and the Dinosaur Hall, showcase the diversity of life on Earth and the forces that shape our natural world. The museum is also a leading research institution, advancing knowledge in fields like anthropology, biology, and paleontology. Its architecture, featuring a grand rotunda, reflects its status as a cornerstone of the Smithsonian Institution and a hub for scientific discovery and education.

NATIONALMUSEUM OF AMERICAN HISTORY

The National Museum of American History, part of the Smithsonian Institution, is dedicated to preserving and interpreting the rich and complex history of the United States. It also serves as a leading research institution, preserving and studying the artifacts and stories that define the age of flight and exploration.

As the Ambassador of the United States to the government and people of Sri Lanka, it gives me great pleasure to dedicate the souvenir booklet for the America Sri Lanka Photographic Art Society Exhibition.

Sri Lanka truly deserves its nickname, Jewel of the Indian Ocean. Each day I am reminded of the beauty of this country, which is steeped in rich history and ethnic diversity. Not only is the climate warm but the people are some of the friendliest on earth. The

national parks with abundant flora and fauna, the ruins of ancient cities and temples, and endless beaches add to the country's bountiful appeal.

Just a few highlights: Earlier this year, my husband and I scaled the heights of Adam's Peak, arriving at the summit just in time to see the colorful sun rise. In addition to offering spectacular views, Adam's Peak is widely known for the Sacred Footprint, venerated by Buddhists, Hindus, Muslims, and Christians, attracting thousands of pilgrims and tourists every year.

Not only have I travelled to the heights of Sri Lanka but also the depths. The Godawaya shipwreck, located off the coast of Hambantota in southern Sri Lanka, is the oldest known shipwreck in Asia, dating back to the Second Century B.C. It was awe inspiring to dive the crystal-clear waters to explore what remains of this ancient vessel. I am particularly proud since the United States government is supporting the study of the wreck and preservation of the artifacts recovered through a grant from the Ambassador's Fund for Cultural Preservation. The items recovered, such as pottery and beads, will eventually be exhibited at the Maritime History Museum in Galle, to be appreciated by local and foreign visitors, and the whole project is a testament to Sri Lanka's long history of free and open waterways and a great example of the strong bonds of friendship and collaboration that exist between our two countries.

An increasing number of tourists from all over the world are discovering this spectacular country, and I hope that the photos in this exhibit inspire you to visit too. I am sure you will fall in love with Sri Lanka and its people, just as I have

The nation also has a remarkable history, culture, and important monuments. Accordingly, it contains 8 UNESCO World Heritage sites. Professor MacDonald noted that the population of Sri Lanka had grown significantly over recent decades to over 22 million people, which produces challenges in protecting the environment, the many rare species in Sri Lanka, and supporting its people.
